everlasting covenant,
my steadfast, sure love for

- ⁴ Behold, I made him a witness to
the peoples,
a leader and commander for the
peoples.
- ⁵ Behold, you shall call a nation that
you do not know,
and a nation that did not know
you shall run to you,
because of the LORD your God, and
of the Holy One of Israel,
for he has glorified you."

wish that I myself were accursed and

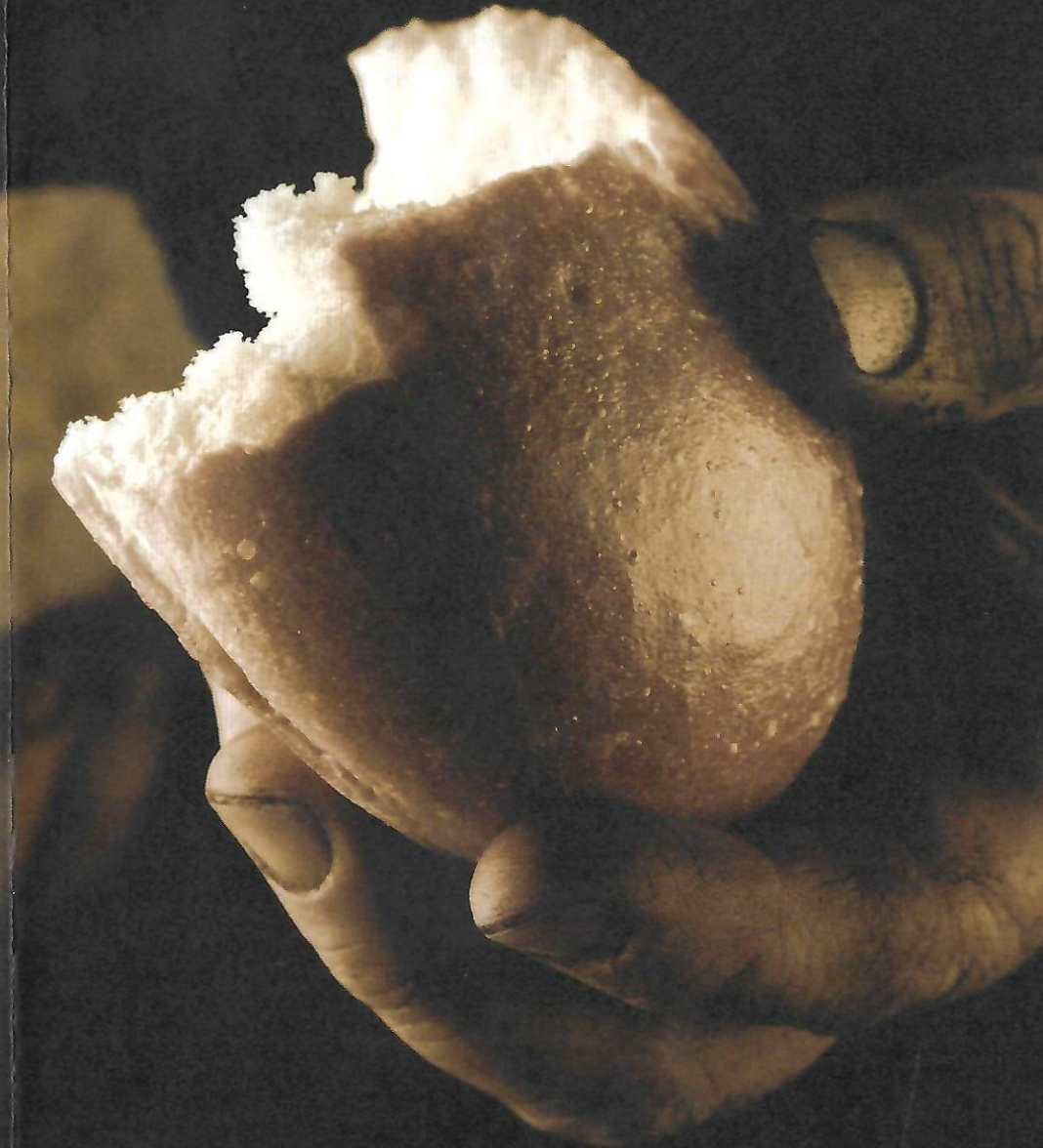
cut off from Christ for the sake of my

Holy Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21

¹³Now when Jesus heard [about the
death of John], he withdrew from
there in a boat to a desolate place by
himself. But when the crowds heard
it, they followed him on foot from the
towns. ¹⁴When he went ashore he saw
a great crowd, and he had compassion
on them and healed their sick. ¹⁵Now
when it was evening, the disciples
came to him and said, "This is a des-
olate place, and the day is now over;
send the crowds away to go into the
villages and buy food for themselves."
¹⁶But Jesus said, "They need not go
away; you give them something to
eat." ¹⁷They said to him, "We have
only five loaves here and two fish."
¹⁸And he said, "Bring them here to
me." ¹⁹Then he ordered the crowds to
sit down on the grass, and taking the
five loaves and the two fish, he looked
up to heaven and said a blessing.
Then he broke the loaves and gave
them to the disciples, and the disci-
ples gave them to the crowds. ²⁰And
they all ate and were satisfied. And
they took up twelve baskets full of the
broken pieces left over. ²¹And those
who ate were about five thousand
men, besides women and children.
